- Computers are used in four general areas:
  - Hospital information systems
  - Diagnostic testing
  - Educational tools
  - Research

Therefore it is essential that you have a working knowledge (computer literacy) of the computer!

# Computer Application

- Today's health care provider uses computers in every facility
- Computers are used for:
  - Word processing
  - Compiling databases
  - Scheduling
  - Maintaining financial records
  - Monitoring patients
  - Performing diagnostics tests
  - Maintaining inventories
  - Developing spreadsheets
  - communication

# Patients Admittance Information

# Advantages of Computerized Databases

- Records can be retrieved quickly and easily
- Records can be sorted (example organizing charts alphabetically or by insurance company)
- Information can be accessed by more than one person at a time
- Additions and changes can be entered easily
- Data can be entered in a readable form
- Reports can be generated

# Internet use

- At this time materials placed on the internet is not regulated
- Not all information is reliable
- Guidelines to help evaluate sites:
  - Identify the source
  - Determine the author
  - Check for accuracy
  - Verify important data
  - Look for signs of quality
  - Check for currency

# Communication with internet

- Electronic Mail (E-mail)
  - Be clear, accurate, and to the point=professional
- Telemedicine
  - Medicine is practiced over the phone
  - Images such as x-rays can be transmitted
  - Can now access doctors that are far away
- Telepharmacies
  - Allow dispensing of drugs at sites other than pharmacies through a computerized dispensing unit
- Virtual communities
  - Can share and communicate with others
